

1. **KATY DEPOT** is the only surviving Spanish Mission style depot on the MKT. Built in 1911, it is now the home of Boonville Chamber and Tourism offices.

2. **BALLANTINE HOUSE** was built in 1822 by David Ballantine for use as a hotel. One of the oldest brick structures in Boonville.

3. **VETERANS MEMORIAL** dedicated in 2004.

4. **MKT BRIDGE** can be viewed from the Boonville Highway Bridge walkway. The bridge was constructed in 1932; at the time, its 400-foot long central lift span was the longest in the country. It is part of the rail corridor that forms the 225-mile long Katy Trail State Park.

5. **HOTEL FREDERICK** was built in 1905 by Charles Sombart, a local miller and banker. Recently restored it is now a charming boutique hotel.

6. **CLARK HOUSE** is one of the oldest houses in Boonville, built in 1829-30 by R.P. Clark, first circuit clerk of Cooper County.

7. **WILLIAMS/ KEMPER HOUSE** was built in 1898 and has been beautifully restored.

8. **THE BELL HOUSE** was built in 1886 by Charles Bell, "Missouri's Apple King."

9. **BELL'S VIEW PARK**, across from the Bell House, was donated to the city by Charles Bell in 1912.

10. **BIRTHPLACE OF WALTER WILLIAMS** built in 1840-1850.

11. **THE OLD JAIL & HANGING BARN** is now the offices of the Friends of Historic Boonville. The last public hanging in 1930 was carried out in the barn behind the jail.

12. **MORGAN STREET PARK** has been developed into a memorial space that contains a statue of Hannah Cole as the main focal point, with busts of six prominent persons in Boonville's history.

13. **THESPIAN HALL** was built in 1855-57. It is the oldest surviving theater west of the Allegheny Mountains.

14. **THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH** built in 1841 and 1872. It is located on Main and Vine Streets, facing east. It is a wonderful example of Baroque architecture.

15. **TURNER HALL** was built in 1847 as the first brick Baptist Church west of St. Louis. Turner Hall has been restored and is available to rent for events and meetings.

16. **BOONSLICK REGIONAL LIBRARY** hosts a portrait of Mary Gay Wyan Nelson painted in 1877 by George Caleb Bingham. Mary and her husband, Thomas, ran a plantation on the eastern edge of Boonville.

17. **1840'S QUEEN ANNE - ITALIANATE** is known locally as the "Mittelbach House" and was built in three different phases, 1840, 1870 and 1906. Dr. Mittelbach was a druggist and prominent in community affairs.

18. **ROSLYN HEIGHTS**, built in 1895, was the most elaborate home of that era. In 1983 the Daughters of the American Revolution purchased it for a state headquarters and restored its gay 90's elegance.

19. **KEMPER MILITARY SCHOOL**, started in 1844 by Professor F.T. Kemper, was the oldest military school west of the Mississippi River until its closing in 2002. While the school was operating it was often referred to as the West Point of the West.
3rd Street

20. **HITCH HOUSE** was built by William Hoge, Kemper Commandant of Cadets, in 1890. The residence was used as cadet barracks in WWI. It has been used as a residence of Kemper presidents since 1902. It is now a private residence.

21. **CHRIST CHURCH EPISCOPAL** built in 1844 is the oldest surviving Episcopal church west of the Mississippi.

22. **HAIN HOUSE** is a typical 19th century single family dwelling. The home was donated to the Friends of Historic Boonville in the 1980's. Hain Memorial Gardens is open for public use by arrangement.

23. **KATY TRAIL HEAD** is one of the many trail heads along the longest rails-to-trails projects in the nation, the Katy Trail State Park.
